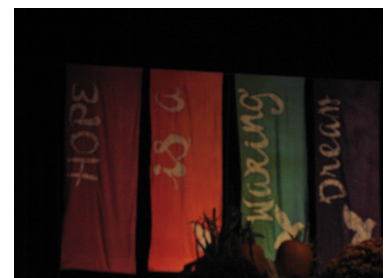

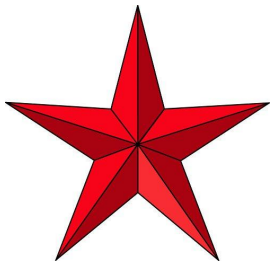
Rexton 10th Annual Dog Walk

Hearing & Speech Report:

I was unsuccessful in obtaining hard copies of Hear World Communications Catalog. However, as the 21st Century is here, so is on-line shopping. Below is the website for Hear World Communications. I would ask each club to spend a few minutes with this item as most of us do not have a problem with hearing & or speech but you can all relate to someone that does.

This catalog has it all, just browse through the pages. I will suggest two items, one on page 30 and one on page 69. The first, an amplified phone device for those with hearing loss, including those that already are equipped with a hearing aid that have a hard time hearing on the phone. It is a Clarity W 10 in-line amplifier. It can add 25 DB to your phone. The second is speech amplified phone that can increase your speech up to 50DB.

These devices can help many but may be of no use to others. Make sure you can return with a money back guarantee. Lions: do you or your partner bother each other with the TV cranked up in the bedroom when one is trying to get to sleep? Why not get a Sennheiser Wireless TV Amplify System. Turn the TV volume off and use the Sennheiser Headset.

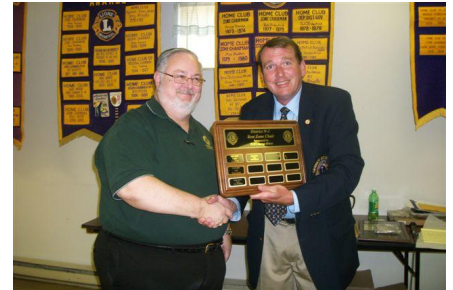
