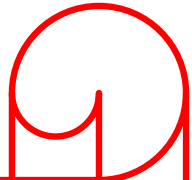
Lion Fred Johnson and Lion Brent Buchanan were presented with Melvin Jones Fellowships at Nashwaaksis Lions year end dinner.

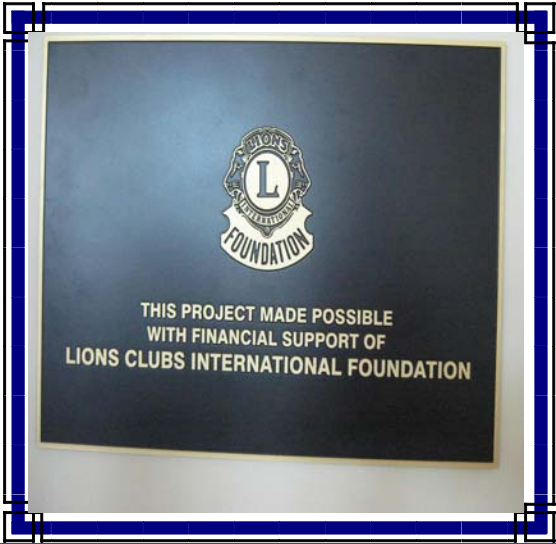
