LIONS IN SERVICE

District N-1 Lions Clubs collect 30,095 pairs of eye glasses

On November 30, 2010, members of the Barkers Point North side Lions Club delivered 30,095 pairs of glasses for shipment to Alberta on behalf of all 83 clubs from New Brunswick, PEI and the state of Maine. This year's collection is an estimated 50% increase from 2009.

One of District N-1 Lion's key activities is the eye glass collection program in which clubs from within the district collect eye glasses that citizens of their communities have out grown. There are also drop off boxes at local optometrists in which people can discard their old eye glasses after picking up their new eye glasses. The Lions Clubs take all types of glasses whether they are prescription eye glasses, sun glasses and even reading glasses purchased at the local dollar stores, for both adults and children.

The district clubs box up the glasses minus the cases and identify the total number per box for drop off for Lion Gary Rideout of the Barkers Point Northside Lions Club. Lion Gary is the District Eye Glass Co-ordinator who spends his spare time adding the new number of glasses received to his on-going tally sheet, securing the boxes and storing the boxes in his shed. Towards the end of each calendar year, the boxes are then loaded and delivered to Hoyt's Moving and Storage located in Fredericton's Industrial Park who transports the eye glasses at no charge to a prison in Alberta. The eye glasses are stored in a warehouse and then sorted and catalogued by inmates at the prison for shipment to third world countries.

One of the members of the Barkers Point Northside Lions Club, Lion Kathy McCarthy, recently was in Jacmel, Haiti and delivered 250 pairs of glasses generously donated by Dr. Louiselle St. Amand from Perth Andover, NB. Lion Kathy made the donation to Dr. Reynold Monsanto who spoke of his overwhelming job, lack of supplies and gratefulness in receiving the glasses for distribution to the people in need.

These are heart warming stories of taking something that we normally toss in a drawer or in the garbage that can make the world of difference to someone less fortunate in a third world country. Imagine being able to read or see thanks to receiving a pair of these glasses fitted to their needs by their local clinic or doctor.

Lion John is a wonderful ambassador for our Lions Club and he has tremendous support from our community and surrounding area.


