





Watch for seat sales. The Corner Brook Airport Shuttle costs \$18.00, each way.

#### Info if you travel by the North Sydney-Port Aux Basques Ferry:

- In October there are ferry departures from North Sydney at 11:30 AM and 11:30 PM daily
- The driving distance from Port Aux Basques to Corner Brook is 218Km

#### MD REQUEST RE POSSIBILITY OF CHARTER BUS

Our Fall Conference Organizing Committee will provide optional Coachline Services (law prohibits the use of school busses taking passengers with luggage) to meet a group of Lions at the ferry terminal in Port Aux Basques, if there is sufficient interest from those who wish to park their cars in North Sydney.

To test Lions interest in this option, we have tentatively booked one 47-passenger coachline bus operated by Buckle's Busing. Passengers would travel by bus from North Sydney, taking the 11:30 PM night crossing Thursday, October 23, and would arrive at Port Aux Basques Friday morning, October 24th.

Upon arrival at Port Aux Basques, the bus group would be transported from the ferry to the port's main terminal by Marine Atlantic courtesy busses (luggage included). At the main terminal, the group would transfer their baggage to the exterior units of Buckle's bus, and then board the bus. When all the passengers are assembled on the bus, it will depart for Corner Brook. At Corner Brook, passengers would be dropped off at their various hotels -- this should be complete by or before Noon on Friday.

The reverse process would take place on Sunday Morning, October 26, with the bus picking up passengers at 7:15 AM, and departing Corner Brook at 7:30 AM. Arrival at the ferry terminal at would be 10:15 AM, with the ferry departing at 11:30 AM. Passengers would arrive back in North Sydney at 5:30 PM, on Sunday.

Our fee for the return bus service PAB/CB is \$34.00 per person.

Here are the rules:

- 1. There must be a full or near full busload that wishes to travel this way
- 2. Everyone would have to travel from North Sydney on the same ferry
- 3. Passengers must book their return boat passage with Marine Atlantic
- 4. All passengers must book their return bus passage with our Committee
- 5. Deadlines for booking and paying for your bus transportation is Sept 26th
- 6. This bus package deal does not permit any partial refunds for one way travel
- 7. Refunds will be made to those who paid for bus package, if there is insufficient bookings to warrant bus travel by Sept 26th
- 8. There will be absolutely no refunds made re: this package after Sept. 30th

#### DR. PATRICIA HILL INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR



Dr. Patricia Hill from Edmonton, Alberta, Canada, was elected to serve a two year term as a director of The International Association of Lions Clubs at the association's 90th International Convention, held in Chicago, Illinois, USA, July 2-6, 2007.

Director Hill is a psychologist.

A member of the Edmonton Host Lions Club since 1990, Director Hill has held many offices within the association, including club president, zone chairperson, district governor and council chairperson. She also served as district chairperson for Membership, Environment, Convention and International Cooperation and Understanding. Additionally she has served as a committee member for the USA/ Canada Lions Leadership Forum, multinational coordinator for Campaign SightFirst II, secretary for Lions Eyebank (Alberta) Society, director of the Lions Eye Research Institute of Northern Alberta and presenter and multiple forums and conventions.

In recognition of her service to the association, Director Hill has received numerous awards, including multiple Club President's Appreciation Awards, District Lion of the Year, an Extension Award, induction to the Multiple District 37 Hall of Fame, several District Governor's Certificates of Appreciation, five International President's Certificates of Appreciation and an International President's Medal. She is also a Judge Brian Stevenson Fellow, Denise and Jack Isaman Fellow and a Melvin Jones Fellow.

In addition to her Lions activities, Director Hill is active in numerous professional and community organizations. She is a member of the Psychologists Association of Alberta, the Canadian Psychological Association and the Community League. In the past, she served as president of the Alberta Association of Psychologists and the Association of Canadian Educators of the Hearing Impaired.

Director Hill and her husband, Gregory Holmes, also a Lion, have two children.
