District N-1 Awards Committee Report to the Charlottetown Cabinet Meeting November 24, 2007

Fellow Lions:

At the Organizational Cabinet Meeting in August held at the Geary Lions Club, I asked what was to be done with the two districts' trophies. (I gotta stop asking questions.) As a result of that question a committee was formed to recommend to cabinet which trophies to keep.

That committee consists of PCC Sonny Bonnell; PCC Rheal Cormier; PDG Fred Cook & me

Our recommendations are that:

- 1. District N-1 start with brand new trophies
 - a. We feel that to remove the title & name plates would be a disservice to the donor of the trophy and of the winners. Name plates would end up in a drawer somewhere, get forgotten and eventually thrown out.
- 2. District 41-O & District 41-N1 retire all their existing trophies.
- That existing trophies be returned to the donor. Should the donor be deceased, then the trophy should be given to the last winner.
- 4. The honour of donating a trophy to the new district should fall first to the donor of the retiring trophy. In the event there is more than one donor for the same trophy, the names will be placed in a hat and one name will be drawn, the other individual would be offered an opportunity to sponsor a trophy in an open category. For any trophy that remains un-sponsored, we recommend that it be sponsored by an active Lion.
- 5. We recommend that District N-1 award trophies I the following categories
 - a. Best President
 - b. Best Secretary
 - c. Best Zone Chair
 - Visitation Award (Three)
 - i. Clubs 20 & Under
 - ii. Clubs 21 29
 - iii. Clubs 30 & Over
 - e. Lion of the Year
 - f. Rookie of the Year
 - g. Baby Lion of the Year
 - h. Best Club
 - i. Best District Chair
 - j. Most eyeglasses Recycled
 - k. Best Bulletin/Newsletter
 - l. Mot Improved Club
 - m. Largest Donation to Lions Foundation of Canada
 - n. Largest Donation to Lions Clubs International Foundation
 - o. Scrapbook

Your committee will render a decision by the next cabinet meeting.

We submit this report to the Cabinet and ask for a vote of approval at the next Cabinet Meeting on February 3, 2008 to be held at the Simonds Lions Club. We ask that this be published in the District Governor's newsletter for all clubs to read.

When this report is approved, The Awards Committee recommends that it be put in the District's Policy Manual.

At the next Cabinet Meeting in February the committee will present recommendations for the criteria to be followed for these awards.

My fellow Lions:

Many children who graduate high school and go on to further their education are faced with severe financial, emotional, and social challenges. The residents of Portage Atlantic face these challenges as well as the added challenge of staying drug and alcohol free. Unfortunately, in our society today, drug and alcohol abuse is a problem that will not go away. Therefore we must do everything we can to help these youth become drug and alcohol free and receive the education to become productive in society.

Last year a District project was undertaken to assist these students by way of a bursary fund, named to honor Lion Ron Evans who has put his heart and soul into raising the awareness of the need for the facility we now have at Cassidy Lake and the funds necessary to expand to help more of our youth. Our first "Lion Ron Evans Bursary" of \$1000 was presented at the graduation ceremony in September 2007.

The District held a event in honor of Lion Ron. Many Lions, including ID Terry Graham, and citizens dropped in to take part and make a donation. We raised over \$7,000 in approximately 4 hours to give this Bursary fund a good start.

District Governor Luke is committed to keep this an ongoing District project, and therefore the bursary must be funded this year and every year as long as there is a need. I have agreed to chair this project for this year.

AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL

To all Club Presidents and Secretaries

RE: Changes to due dates for Monthly Membership Reporting by Clubs

Beginning in April 2008, there will be change in the due dates for clubs to submit their monthly membership reports to LCI. As explained in the linked Frequently Asked Question (FAQ) document, the changes will (1) enable LCI to produce more timely monthly membership reports, and (2) provide more accuracy and consistency between data on club roster reports and LCI billing statements and financial recap reports.

Read the FAQ document for an explanation of the new reporting dates and information on where to direct any inquiries.

New Process for Monthly Membership Reporting by Clubs

Effective April 2008

Overview & Frequently Asked Questions

Overview

Beginning in April 2008, there will be a change in the submission dates for clubs to report their monthly membership reports (MMRs). These reporting changes will apply both to clubs that report their membership transactions online (though the online WMMR system) and for clubs that submit paper MMRs to international headquarters. As explained below, the overall goals are to (1) enable LCI to produce more timely cumulative monthly membership reports, and (2) provide more consistency and accuracy between the LCI cumulative monthly member report and Club Billing Statements and District Financial Recap reports.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What exactly will be the changes to monthly membership reporting?

Currently, membership reporting is released by LCI on a one-month lag. For example, the May Cumulative Membership and Club Summary Report is released on June 29th and utilizes transactions (adds or drops) that are created through on the 28th of June. As such, the "May" report has transactions that were created from May 28th through June 28th 4:00 PM (local time in Oak Brook).

Under the new membership reporting process, which will become effective in April 2008, reports will be released as of the most recent calendar month end. For example, the May report will have transactions that were created from May 1st – May 31st. The report will be generated 5 days after the last day of the month.

Q: Why were the changes necessary?

This will allow the association to report membership on a timely basis.

Q: Will the due dates change for monthly membership reporting?

Yes, for clubs that report online through the WMMR system, transactions must now be entered by the last day of the current month. And for clubs that file paper MMR reports, they must submit paper MMRs to LCI by the 20th of the current month.

Transaction entered on the WMMR will be reported in the current month. For example, transactions entered on July 7th will be considered a "July" reporting.

Mailed reports, must be received by the 20th of the month, to be included in that month's cumulative report. Reports, received after that date, will be recorded in the membership system with the current month; however will be included in the next month's cumulative report.

Q: Will this eliminate the LCI cumulative monthly membership reports being a month behind? Yes, the reports will now contain current monthly data, rather than being a month behind.

Q: Must club secretaries still report monthly?

Yes, to help LCI more accurately reflect membership numbers, clubs will still need to report monthly. Previous month's reporting can no longer be submitted past the month's cutoff date.

Q: Will the new reporting dates change the deadline for club charter applications?

The only change for charter applications occurs in the month of June. In order to be chartered in the current fiscal year, completed club charter applications need to be received at LCI headquarters by June 20th. Applications can be received electronically or by fax if necessary.

Q: When will the change in reporting be implemented?

The new reporting will be effective for membership reporting for the month of April 2008.

Q: How many clubs now report online through the WMMR system?

More than 70% of clubs worldwide now report online via the WMMR system. If your club would like to report online and thus be eligible for the latest filing date each month, please contact the Information Technology division by email at: wmmr@lionsclubs.org to receive a password and basic instructions.


