This annual auction is our largest fund raiser. Lion members all have a list of businesses to visit to get donations, whether in cash, goods or gift certificates to be auctioned off. Some businesses prefer to have letters sent out to them a month or two in advance and then our members drop in before the auction to pick up the donation.

All members are kept very busy on the night of the auction, setting up the tables and chairs, passing the items to the auctioneer, delivering the item to the successful bidder. The bidders are all given a number at the door when they come in. Members have to keep track of what number bought what article, so at the end of the evening the money can be collected from each bidder.

We also run a canteen with coffee, donuts, pop, water, chips and bars. This auction netted our club over \$6,000.00 this year.
