

Thank you for accepting the appointment to be your club's youth camp & exchange chairperson. This letter will help you find the information that you will need to organize a youth exchange or to send a youth to camp. Due to the vast amount of information that is available, I am going to provide you with the directions you will need to access all the information you need to organize an exchange or camp, on the International Lions website. Go to <a href="www./ionsclubs.org">www./ionsclubs.org</a> - then click on Volunteer Service Organization -then click your desired language - then on the International page click on Youth Programs -. then on youth programs page click on Youth Camps & Exchanges - from there you can find information on

- Sponsor Lions Club
- Host L ions Club
- Host Family
- Chairpersons & Camp Leaders Past Participants

If you look on the right hand side under **More Information** - click on **Camps and Exchange Directory** - then on that page go to the bottom under **"Potential Participants"** you will see click **"here"** for more information on participation. Click on **"here"** which will take you to Participant Information. There you will be able to find all the information you will need to organize a youth exchange program.

If you do not have access to the internet or if you have a problem with these directions please contact me and I will get a kit to you with the information that you will need.

A youth exchange can be held within our own Province or another province or anywhere around the world.

The International Youth Exchange Program is not conducted for tourism, education, or employment. Instead it is a unique cultural learning opportunity.

Some examples of camps that have been held.

- A traveling camp throughout North Carolina, U.S.A. The campers slept in tents
- A Massachusetts, U.S.A. camp for young people with diabetes.
- An arctic camp sponsored by the Lions of Norway.
- A winter camp in Canada for Youth from the Southern Hemisphere.
- A ten day sailing camp around Finland.
- A camp for physically disabled young people located in Italy.
- A "sound of music" camp for musicians and vocalists held in the Austrian Alps.
- A cruise from Moscow to Saratov down the Volga River.
- An outdoors camp held in New Zealand.
- A cultural camp in Thailand which featured a visit to Grand Palace.
- A nature conservation camp in the Republic of South Africa which included a hike through a wildlife reserve.

Some ideas for a youth exchange could be.

- Between two Lions Clubs.
- Between two schools.
- Between two church groups.
- Between two Leo or youth groups.
- Speak out winners between Regions or Zones etc, etc, etc.

There are many other ways to have a youth exchange, just use you imagination.

How about sending a young diabetic to camp this summer, or young person, in your community with a disability, to a camp. There are many possibilities so let's touch some young person's life and give them an experience to remember for life.


