Report of Constitution and By-Laws Committee

Submitted by PDG Rheal Cormier, Chair February 17, 2010

Proposed Amendments to Constitution, By-Laws and Policy Manual

Amendments to By-Laws

Page 6, Article I, Section 2 b); replace the words "Article III, Section 4" with: "Article IX, Section 6".

Page 6, Article I, Section 2 c); after the words "Article IX", add the words: "Section 6".

Page 7, Article I, Section 3 b), last sentence; after the word "positions", add the words: "of Region Chair (if utilized by the District Governor) and Zone Chairs".

Page 7, Article I, Section 3 c), Sub-Section (v); replace the number "5" with the word: "five".

Page 10, Article III, Section c); replace the existing wording with: "c) Quorum

The attendance of a majority of the members of the Cabinet registered for a meeting shall constitute a quorum for any meeting."

Page 11, Article IV, Section 6; remove "last sentence" and replace with: "The Incoming District Governor shall be the Committee's Chair."

Page 11, Article IV, Section 7; delete the "first two sentences" and replace with the following: "The Incoming District Governor, in conjunction with the Finance Committee, shall prepare a District Budget for presentation and approval at the annual Convention previous to his/her year as District Governor. Said budget shall be published in the District Governor's newsletter prior to the Convention and may be amended only at a subsequent Cabinet Meeting or Convention."

Amendments to Policy Manual

That all items (titles) be numbered for ease of reference.

Page 17, under Appendix E, list of awards, after Environment Award, add; "Humanitarian Award".

Page 20, under Appendix E, after the Environment Award, add criteria as follow;

District N-1

HUMANITARIAN AWARD

Guidelines for this award shall be as follows;

- * ALL Clubs within District N-1 shall be eligible and have an equal opportunity to win this award, irrespective of their membership numbers, financial wealth, or other property resources.
- * "Administrative Duties" of individual club officers are not to be taken into consideration by the selection committee. Criteria, as established by the District for Best Club, Best Club President, Best Club Secretary Awards, shall not be applicable when appraising the eventual winner of this award.
 - * Neither shall financial support for Lions Clubs International Foundation, the Lions Foundation of Canada or club's granting of awards such as a Melvin Jones Fellowship, Judge Brian Stevenson Fellowship, etc., be a determinant in choosing the winner of this award.

The Selection Committee shall base their decision on the following assessments;

* An individual club project, or a collective number of projects promoting local community service.

Examples of qualifying activities would be any that support local Sight Conservation & Work with the

Blind, Hearing Conservation & Work with the Hearing Impaired or Speech Action, Diabetes Awareness, Drug Awareness, etc.

- * The needs and impact of such project(s) to the community
- * The success of the project(s).
- * The extent and participation of all club members, working together to achieve a single goal.
- * A club's overall commitment to the Lions Code of Ethics and Lions Club Objects.

Selection Committee:

Each Zone Chair shall send their nomination to the District Governor. At his/her discretion, the District Governor, in making a decision, may further consult with the Vice-Governor(s) in office.

As members of the Charlottetown Lions Club, we are hopeful that this award will become a prestigious one, eagerly sought after and which will symbolize that the recipient club extended its best efforts **TO SERVE!**

Our mandate from Lions Clubs International is multi-purpose -

To promote the growth in Lionism throughout our Multiple with a shared vision of the future,

To provide leadership, direction and initiative for international and multiple district programs, goals and long range planning.

To create and foster harmony and unity among subdistricts

To assist District Governors with solving issues

To create goals or objectives and develop action plans to achieve results

To fulfill our mandate more revenue is needed. As our main source of revenue is membership dues, and our membership numbers have been spiraling downward, Multiple District N Council of Governors, with the recommendation from the Budget and Audit Chair, has approved a dues increase of \$1.50 per member to be effective July 1, 2010, to be taken to the LIONS of Multiple District N at the convention in May for their support and approval. 60% of this increase is returned to the subdistricts through Education and Training.

This increase is required to ensure our programs and services can continue to develop and expand -

To cover the increasing cost of using better teaching technology equipment for LIONS/DG /VDG training at the MDN cabinet meetings and conventions.

To cover the cover of printed materials for training purposes

To assure the Districts Officers, DG's and all VDG's receive the highest education training possible and so that they can carry out their duties at a very high standard

To ensure high quality Leadership training is available to all Lions

To provide new support for the training to the 2nd Vice District Governor

To provide resources, both opportunistic and developmental, for Youth membership development

To provide funding to the Regional Institutes to help keep costs manageable for all Lions

To allow existing programs to continue and explore the development of new programs

To allow every Lion to contribute to the success and growth of our Multiple through efficient administration and balanced operating budgets.

To encourage increased participation with adequate funding to develop innovative promotions of Lions and training programs to attract younger membership growth in the subdistricts

With visionary growth management and well managed expenditures, the need for further increases should eliminated for quite some time

We are requesting that each Lion do what we as Lions do best and reach into your hearts and your pockets to provide your Multiple with the support needed to do the job entrusted to us. Please **vote "yes"** to the motion for Dues Increase of \$1.50 per member.

MDN Council:

Lion Susan, the Budget & Audit chair has provided me with the following figures with regards to education and training expenses for MDN:

2008-2009

MDN collected \$0.85 per Multiple District Lion to provide education and training for the MDN Lions, which brought in a total of \$6169.80. This may sound like a lot until you start looking at the expenditure side of the equation. Two Districts applied for the MDN Training Grant at \$700.00 each totaling \$1400.00. This is money that goes back to the Districts to help with their training expenses. The Multiple covers the rooms for the incoming District Governors for their two days of training which totaled \$1075.76. (This is money that that directly benefits the Districts and impacts the Districts finances.) The reception and meals for the two days of training for the incoming DG's and the 1st & 2nd Vice-District Governors cost \$1205.14 and the cost of training materials totaled \$447.34. Expenses for instructors totaled \$808.38 which covered travel, meals and rooms. (The MDN Convention where the training took place was in Nova Scotia.)

The Multiple District also funded the MDN Leadership Institute (held in N-4) with a \$1000.00 grant.

The expenses of the Training & Leadership Chair totaled \$1332.55.

The total expenses in 2008-2009 were \$7269.17 or \$1099.37 more than was collected and not counting the \$1400.00 in MDN Training Grant monies that were not applied for which would have take that to a total of \$3499.37 more than was brought in.

2007-2008

MDN collected \$0.85 per Multiple District Lion to provide education and training for the MDN Lions, which brought in a total of \$5083.43. Again, let's look at the expenses. Four Districts applied for the MDN Training Grant at \$700.00 each for a total of \$2800.00. This is money that goes back to each of the Districts to assist with their training. The Multiple covers the rooms for the incoming District Governors for their two days of training which totaled \$1416.92. The reception and meals for the two days of training for the incoming DG's and the 1st & 2nd Vice-District Governors cost \$795.47 and the cost of the training materials totaled \$373.40. Expenses for instructors totaled \$1155.43, which covered travel, meals and rooms. (The MDN Convention was held in Prince Edward Island)

The Multiple District Leadership Institute was held in N-2 with no monies allotted from Multiple District N.

The expenses of the Training & Leadership Chair totaled \$661.06 with another \$65.55 for the payment of training materials.

The total expenses in 2007-2008 were \$7267.83 or \$2184.40 more than was collected.

The Lions of Multiple District N can not continue to under-fund the budget by not raising enough funding. The only means of funding that MDN has is the dues collected by the membership. If our membership continues to decline the impact is less monies coming in to fund the programs that the MDN Lions have set forth in their Constitution & By-Laws as important to them. We must provide those services as per the mandate of the Constitution and we ask you, the LIONS of the Multiple to assist by ensuring that the funds are made available.


