OFFICIALLY THE FIRST RECOGNIZED WALK FOR DOG GUIDE AWARENESS (in McAdam) by Margaret Laking

The Walk for Dog Guides is an event which spotlights the contribution of Dog Guides to improve the daily lives of Canadians who must live with visual, hearing, physical and/or medical disabilities

This year to show their awareness and how much they cared, the 1st McAdam Girl Guides, Brownies and Sparks held their own special walk for Dog Guide Awareness. Sixteen young ladies, their leaders, McAdam Lion members including their President Roy Sherman, Sr., guests, McAdam Mayor, Frank Carroll and MLA Carl Urquhart joined the walk to show their support for the girls' endeavour. Four Sparks, ages five and six years old; four Brownies, ages seven and eight and eight Girl Guides made the round-trip walk along the main street from the McAdam Lions Community Centre to the McAdam Railway Station and back.

Each Guide, Brownie, Spark, Leader and guest walked with a chocolate lab Webkinz puppy. Webkinz is the plush pet from Ganz Each Webkinz comes with an attached card carrying a secret code. The code allows the child to participate in this virtual world without giving personal information such as surname, phone number or email address

Guide Leader, Laura Sherman was responsible for the donation of the Webkinz lab puppies from Ganz, which is located in Woodbridge, Ontario. Sherman said: All of my kids have Webkinz and I've seen how much fun they have with them and how cute they are. I sent an email to Ganz telling them that the girls were walking in the Purina Walk for Dog Guides with a local person who has benefited from having a Dog Guide.

I told them the dog's name was Porter and he was a chocolate lab and asked if they would donate some chocolate labs so the girls could have their own "Porter" to walk with that day. Malka Rosenburg from Ganz replied telling me they would send some to us. A couple weeks later I received 30 chocolate lab Webkinz enabling each walker to walk with a puppy of their own.

The Mayor of McAdam, Frank Carroll officially declared the day of the walk as "Dog Guide Awareness Day" in the village.

MLA, Carl Urquhart spoke of the event in the legislature. Urquhart had his own chocolate lab Webkinz with him and stated: "I would like to introduce the House to our little dog on this side and his name is Porter. My job is to look after Porter all day. This being Dog Guide Awareness Day for dog guides, this is my job. The real Porter is a chocolate lab that lives with James Laking and his wife, Margaret out in McAdam.

After the walk each girls received an officially signed certificate of appreciation from the Lions Foundation of Canada for raising awareness through their own special walk for dog guides. The walk followed the same agenda as the actual Purina Walk for Dog Guides - an opening statement, the walk, return to the starting point and food! Several members of the McAdam Lions Club prepared and served hot dogs and juice for the girls.

The Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides is a "paws-on" operation. They have a breeding facility at Breslau, Ontario and raise most of their puppies, placing them in foster homes for their first year. Nestlé Purina PetCare Canada has been supporting Lions Foundation of Canada from the start. Purina provides top quality food for all the Foundation dog guides, giving thousands of puppies a wonderful start in life! Once matured, the dogs are selected and trained for six to eight months, which is then followed by recipients staying at the Foundation for two to four weeks to be matched and learn how to work with their new Dog Guide partners.

This year, the Foundation designated June as the official walk month. The Walk for Dog Guides 2009 has been set for Sunday, May 31st.

Three months after the Walk, Porter was officially retired. Laking will be making a trip to the Lions Foundation of Canada Sir James Dunn Dog Guide Training Centre in Oakville, Ontario and returning in early December with a new Dog Guide partner
