**MINUTES OF THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF LIONS CLUBS DISTRICT N-1  
FIRST CABINET MEETING  
BARKER'S POINT LIONS CLUB  
23 SEPTEMBER, 2007.**

District Governor Luke Stennick called the meeting to order at 11:30 a.m.

Lion Betty Hoban led in the singing of "The Star Spangled Banner."

Past-District Governor Frank Sullivan led in the singing of "O Canada."

PCST John "Happy Jack" MacPherson led in the blessing, Lions Invocation, and a moment of silence for world peace and deceased lions, with special remembrances observed by his listing of all Lions who have passed away this lionistic year.

DG Luke then announced a few minor changes to the agenda. It was then moved by Lion Terry Kavanagh and seconded by Zone Chair Claude LeBlanc, that the agenda be approved, motion carried.

DG Luke welcomed International Director Ed Lecus and his wife Elaine, Lions Foundation of Canada Director from Quebec, PDG Maurice Pouliot, and LFC National Spokesperson Beverley Beger. He also congratulated the Barker's Point Lions Club on their 50th Charter Anniversary held the previous evening and the Grand ashademoak Lions Club on their 25th Charter Anniversary which he attended last week.

DG Luke then introduced the head table, consisting of himself, Barker's Point King Lion Sandy Taylor, VDG Rod Wright, ID Ed and CST George Mitton.

DG Luke asked that all PDGs present stand and be recognized. 14 PDGs were acknowledged.

DG Luke introduced KL Sandy, and she welcomed all lions in attendance.

DG Luke recognized the representatives of LFC in attendance, LFC Director NB PDG Fred Cook, LFC Director QC PDG Maurice Pouliot, and LFC Chairman of the Board Fred Phillips.

He then introduced LFCs' National Spokesperson Bev Beger.

Mrs. Beger spoke to the meeting on the work of the foundation, her life experience and her dog guide "Jasper." She also invited any and all lions to visit the training centre in Oakville, ON.

COB Fred then presented Lion Merlene Smith with a LFC Life Membership.

DG Luke then introduced ID Ed. ID Ed congratulated the lions of District N-1 on their hard work in the re-districting process and brought greetings from our International President.

The meeting then adjourned for lunch.

When the meeting reconvened, DG Luke introduced PDG Maurice Pouliot, LFC Director QC, who thanked the meeting for their hospitality and spoke on LFC.

DG Luke introduced Vice-District Governor Rod Wright, VDG Rod spoke on Campaign Sight First II and his challenge to clubs to purchase Melvin Jones Fellowships in support of the campaign. He also spoke of the importance of all lions working as a T.E.A.M. He then asked his wife, Lion Norah Davidson-Wright to come forward, and presented her with a bouquet of flowers on the occasion of their 1st anniversary.

CST George took roll call and was answered by 43 clubs and a total of 108 members. Roll was also answered by 11 Zone Chairs and 34 Committee Chairs.

The minutes of the organizational meeting held at the Geary Lions Club on 18 August, 2007, having been circulated, were approved.

CST George then presented the Proposed Budget and Financial Report as of 21 September, 2007.

Discussion followed concerning the District Fund-raising Project, the balancing of dues from the two previous districts, DG International Convention v. DG Melvin Jones Fellowship, and that the budget for Speak Out was perhaps low.

On a point of order, PCC Rheel Cormier noted that there should be a motion on the floor regarding the budget prior to discussion. It was then moved by VDG Rod and seconded by PDG Larry Barton to approve the proposed budget. Lengthy discussion followed concerning MD-N Fall Conference registration fees, the district fund-raising project, and funds from the previous administrations. On this topic, it was reported by PCST Gerry Forsythe that he had received his audit report on Friday and that approx. \$1500.00 would be coming to N-1 from 41-N1. PDG Jack Moffitt reported that he had experienced some delays with 41-O's audit, but was actively working on it. Fund-raising Chairperson PDG Jan Phillips spoke on various fund-raising ideas. The question was then called on the motion and it was carried.

DG Luke then recognized Speak Out Chair Norm Coffin and apologized for his omission from the committee list. He then called for any reports from the districts' Zone Chairs, they were as follows:

1. Zone 5 Chair PDG Fred Cook submitted a written report and announced a zone meeting for 2 October, 2007, at the Riverview Lions Club.



2. Zone 6 Chair Paul Babin reported on the Bouctouche Lions Club and their difficulties with the province on licencing issues and wants all clubs to be aware of this situation.
3. Zone 14 Chair Don Doran reported on his zone meeting and urged all clubs to attend their respective zone meetings and keep the monthly reports coming.
4. Zone 2 Chair PCST Doug Cook sent his regrets via DG Luke. He reported that the one club under suspension from Lions International had rectified the situation.
5. Zone 7 Chair Claude LeBlanc and Zone 8 Chair Lucio Cordisco both submitted written reports. DG Luke then asked for reports from committee chairs, they were as follows:
  1. Potage Atlantic, Lion Ron Evans circulated his report and thanked all contributors.
  2. Portage Christmas Party, VDG Rod announced that the Christmas Party will be held on 9 December, 2007. The cost of a present is \$75 and any club wishing to purchase one should contact him.
  3. IPDG Boyd Sangster presented a New Horizon Award in Diabetes Education to the Lincoln Lions Club. He also reported that the first Lion Ron Evans Bursary would be given out at this years graduation of Portage Atlantic and the importance of keeping this fund going. Contributions to the fund can be made via the McAdam Lions Club Foundation c/o Lion Frank Carroll 12 Rose St. McAdam NB E6J 2B3 506-784-3113.
  4. PCC Rheal Cormier reported that the Policy Manual Committee had met, and that progress was being made towards the presentation of a new manual for District N-1. Any suggestions should be forwarded to the committee.
  5. IPDG Tim Hoban reported on the purchase of 2 MJF and 4 Brian Stevenson Awards by District 41-N1 last year. He also reported on his involvement with the province of New Brunswicks' Task Force on Non-Profit Organizations headed by Claudette Bradshaw.IPDG Tim also introduced a Notice of Motion regarding the position of Deputy Vice-District Governor. See Attached.
6. LFC Director NB PDG Fred submitted his written report and also discussed the qualifications for the position of Director which will become vacant in 2009. Resumes should be submitted to PDG Fred no later than 1 August, 2008. PDG Fred also discussed the Light Bulb Campaign.
7. Cavalcade NB Chair Joe Ruet informed the meeting that he had 28 letters of appreciation for the various clubs that had donated to last years' cavalcade. He also reminded the meeting that this years cavalcade would be held in Woodstock the last Saturday in May.
8. PCST Happy Jack gave a presentation on the role of "Protocol" in our district. Please see Newsletter for his report. He also spoke on Charlottetowns' 55th Charter Anniversary, to be held 24 November, 2007.
9. Campaign Sight First II Co-ordinator PDG Sheila Searle reported on her attendance at a CSFII meeting in Toronto along with Lion Terry Brown and PCC Bev Semple. PDG Sheila reported on the funds being raised in Canada and the grants that have been awarded by LCIF over the years. She also reported on the bracelet campaign.
10. Elections Chair Denzil Bernard informed the meeting that the nomination forms were being prepared and that upon their completion should be forwarded to the CST with a copy to himself.
11. Written reports were submitted by the Alert Chair and the Contests Chair.

#### **Old Business**

DG Luke reported that the No Child Without program was still being worked on by Medic-Alert and PID Terry Graham.

CST George reported that he had received two quotes with regards to bonding. It was moved by Lion Norm Coffin and seconded by IPDG Boyd that the district purchase a fidelity bond in the amount of \$50,000.00 for CST George at a premium of \$370.00 per year. Motion carried.

DG Luke thanked Lion Susan Sangster for her work on the districts' Newsletter.

#### **New Business**

DG Luke brought forth a request from the lions of Quebec for permission to approach French speaking potential clubs in north western New Brunswick. Discussion followed concerning this issue. PDG Maurice of District U-2 spoke on this issue and emphasized that he was here to simply explore the prospect. He explained that at this time re-districting in Quebec was more than likely and that the inclusion of a few NB clubs would not influence this decision. He informed the meeting that DG Robert Belanger would be more than willing to visit areas where potential clubs may be located.

It was then moved by PDG Bob Kirkpatrick and seconded by IPDG Tim that District N-1 honour District 41-Os' previous motion to allow Districts in Quebec to approach french speaking lions clubs with regards to joining Quebec districts. Discussion followed, and PDG Bob reiterated that his motion was simply to honour the motion previously passed by District 41-O. It was then moved by PCC Rheal and seconded by ZC Murray that the motion be amended to include the clubs in the north west corner of New Brunswick. The motion as amended was then passed.

Lion John Roberts was recognized by the chair and he thanked CST George for his work on the





directory. CST George blushed and graciously accepted the meetings' applause. PCST Happy Jack raised the question of the status of the "Lions Memorial Service" in our new District N-1. PCC Rheal informed the meeting that the memorial service would be looked at under the new Policy Manual.

DG Luke reviewed the important dates to remember and thanked the Barker's Point Lions Club for hosting the Cabinet Meeting.

The meeting was then adjourned on a motion by IPDG Tim at 3:18 p.m.

## NOTICE OF MOTION - 23 September, 2007.

**WHEREAS** Article IV "District Organization Cabinet and Officers" Section 1 (a) reads as follows;

"The District Cabinet shall have a District Cabinet composed of the District Governor, the Immediate Past District Governor, the Vice District Governor, the Region Chairpersons (if utilized by the District Governor), the Zone Chairpersons and the Cabinet Secretary Treasurer, who shall be the Officers of the District. In addition the Cabinet shall include as members, the District Committee Chairpersons, President & Secretary of each Club or a designated member, to represent either the club President or the Club Secretary at District Cabinet Meetings. All Cabinet members shall be in good standing in a Lions Club in the District.

And **WHEREAS**

Section 1(c) states;

The Vice District Governor shall be elected at the Annual Convention of the District.

**BE IT RESOLVED** that Article IV Section 1(a) shall be amended as follows;

"The District Cabinet shall have a District Cabinet composed of the District Governor, the Immediate Past District Governor, the Vice District Governor, the Deputy Vice District Governor, the Region Chairpersons (if utilized by the District Governor), the Zone Chairpersons and the Cabinet Secretary Treasurer, who shall be the Officers of the District. In addition the Cabinet shall include as members, the District Committee chairpersons, President & Secretary of each Club, or a designated member, to represent either the Club President or the Club Secretary at the District Cabinet Meetings. All Cabinet members shall be in good standing in a Lions Club in the District." And be it further **RESOLVED THAT** Article IV Section 1(c) shall be amended as follows;

"The Vice District Governor and the Deputy Vice District Governor shall be elected at the Annual Convention of the District."

When Definition # 4 re 'precedence' is observed, rarely will anyone's "nose get out of joint" if they have been properly recognized, or extended a sincere **Thank You** for their volunteer efforts by their club and district leaders !

## How does it apply to having good meetings and running our clubs efficiently ?

In my 38 years of been a Lions member, I have often seen that the most successful clubs are those who have practiced mutual respect and appreciation. Those clubs that understand and follow this Definition, (# 5 ), never seem to have any trouble with Membership growth or Retaining the Lions they already have.

## Most important, what relationship does "Protocol" have to our greeting of each other ?

Thank you so much for giving me a few minute of your time.

First I want to Thank each and every Lions, Lionette, Lioness and Leo Club for their commitment over the many years. We have all worked so hard to get and maintain a youth treatment program for our youth in the Atlantic Provinces.

I also want the Thank you all for helping to raise so much money for our "**Making Miracles Happen**" campaign. We applied to the **LIONS FOUNDATION INTERNATIONAL** for a grant and received the full amount available for that type of grant - (\$75,000.00 US, exchanged to Cdn) \$84,000.00. With the grant included our total to the program, with all the donations from the Lions, Lionettes, Lionettes and Leo's Clubs and also from the Lions Huggy Youth Treatment center was \$200,314.00

I wish to personally thank every Lions, Lionette, Lioness, and Leo's Clubs and all the Board Members of the Lions Huggy Youth Treatment Center.

Our goal at Portage Atlantic was to raise \$1,250,000 so we could start upgrading our Treatment Center. Well, I am pleased to say that we are close to that mark with all the hard work of our Directors and all the fund raising committees. As of this date we have collected \$ 1,200,993

I am inviting everyone to the "Recognition Day" for the youth at the Portage at the Hampton High School, just off the Saint John and Sussex Highway. Everyone is welcome on Sept. 30/07 at 12 noon .

**We at Portage Atlantic have a need in another area. As you know, after treatment there is "after care" program. This is where the caseload caretakers meet with the youth that have graduated from treatment and are at home but are still in need of care. It is sometimes hard to find a place to have these meetings. Perhaps if some of the Lions clubs that have a club house would be able to offer it for these meetings, could you please call Carol at 459-1284 to let her know.**

As a lot of you know, we were able, after many meetings with the New Brunswick Government, to get a commitment from them for \$3,250,000. So at this time we are well into the construction of our new center. Also, on Oct. 10/07 at 12 noon every Lions, Lionettes, Lioness, and Leo's Clubs and members of the Lions Huggy Youth Treatment Center are invited to a program of thanks at Kingwood Lodge on Hanwell Rd. in Fredericton. We wish to thank all the companies and individuals and the Lions family for all the hard work. There will be plaques handed out to different categories of donations.
