Motion for approval of the agenda Lion Gerry seconded by all in favor motion carried Welcoming remarks from Lion Dan Matthews from Dorchester Lions, housekeeping as well if anyone is interested in visiting the den let him know at lunch time.

District Governor Susan introduced the head table. DG Susan recognized the Zone Chairs present, as well as all cabinet chairs and Past District Governors. DG Susan called for any new members present as well as all Lions aand thank you for coming.

DG Susan reviewed information from the DG Organizational Meeting in Harvey. DG Susan addressed her objectives; continue the building blocks that began with PDG Stewart and PDG Lucio, both were successful in having positive growth. DG Susan shared her goal of two new clubs as well as working on Leo Clubs, which is already underway. As well there is some interest in branch clubs, a stepping stone to a traditional club.

International president Joe has introduced the Club Blueprint, available online at International. There is a step by step process.

I found some of the duties I need to perform are rewarding time consuming and costly, one of the things I learned was I was expected to attend the USA Canada Forum, it is a series learning seminars. Very knowledgeable, this year the seminars were done in 3 languages, 2 full days, next year it will be three full days. There were many seminars, Lion Cindi and I attended. VDG Brennan spoke on the forum further. VDG Brennan spoke about the Lions and how PID, Directors, International Presidents were all just Lions.

There was one guest speaker that touched me and showed us what Lions do, all the great work we do in service and support of people.

Once the member is registered the member will receive a welcome from the International President. Lion Gerry has new kits ordered. DG Susan would like to be able to induct your new members when she comes to visit your clubs.

Report from Lion Gerry Forsythe GMT, Lion Gerry stated we had a growth in membership last year, two years in a row. Now we are sitting at a minus 3. Sometimes we lose Lions for nonattendance nonpayment we have to find out why this is happening and try to correct. DG Susan has an objective to reduce the drops by 10% this year. Attached.

DG Susan reviewed the payment time limits for dues to LCI, they are now 90 days. DG Susan reviewed the Financial Suspension time limits.

Report PDG Stewart GLT, protocol has been established. PDG Stewart has offered his training at your clubs, or Zones. CEP was discussed. Mentoring is important. I am building a GLT training team and looking for a bilingual trainer. I have requested the Zone Chair send their ideas for training to me so we can schedule training. Full report attached.

Zone Chair Liaison report 8 Zone Chairs attended. They have received a lot of information, please welcome them and respect them.

DG Susan asked the Zone chairs to come forward and receive their Zone Chair badges for the year. PDG Jan Phillips Lions Foundation of Canada for New Brunswick, PDG Jan thanked the Lions for their support donations are up. The Memorial Forest is going well. One of the Lions created a website of the memorial forest www.lfcmemorialforest.org

PDG Jan has promotional CD's, we have several fundraising events. PDG Jan is looking for her replacement to take affect October 2015.

Lion Doug Cook LFC PEI Director, we have had 152 clients graduate and we plan on 160 this year. Donations continue to rise and PEI had the largest percentage increase across Canada.

PDG Denzil Speakout Chair, encourages more clubs to participate in the Speakout. PDG Denzil is trying to increase the number of speakers allowed, thinking we can allow more from each Zone. Harvey may have a speaker as well this year.

Lion Don Smith, Constitution and By Laws are setting up rules for CDA, putting language together for appointing a CDA representative. Budget for peace poster, Rules for who can nominate from the floor Zone Chairs.

DG Susan asked for a motion for Peace Poster to go to the November Cabinet Meeting. We can change the date for this year but cannot change policy. Approved.

Lion Bill ODonnell newsletter chair, honored to hold this position. Name the newsletter will be voted on at the November Cabinet meeting. Lots of pictures please.

Lion Paul Gauthier, CDA Tag day November 22nd please do not interfere with Remembrance Day. Three clubs have requested kits. Lion Paul shared what his club did last year.
