On a voyage in 1604, Samuel-de-Champlain named the city.

American British supporters arrived in 1783 following the American Revolution, Saint John, the 'Loyalist city' was incorporated by Royal Charter in 1785, making it Canada's first incorporated city. Also referred to as 'the Port City,' Saint John became a leading industrial center since the nineteenth century, predominantly due to a shipbuilding trade. The city quickly grew, with the largest influx of immigrants occurring during the Irish famine of the 1840's, adding 'Canada's most Irish City' to its list of names.
